This consumer disclosure report is designed to provide essential information about California Miramar University's (CalMU) policies, safety protocols, student resources, and federal compliance, offering transparency to students, parents, and regulatory bodies. The report meets IPEDS, Title IV, and Clery Act requirements, ensuring that students are informed about campus security, financial aid options, and educational resources.

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1. Institutional Information

Accreditation

California Miramar University (CalMU) is accredited by the Distance Education Accrediting Commission (DEAC) and holds approvals from applicable state and federal regulatory bodies.

Programs Offered

CalMU offers graduate and undergraduate degree programs designed to serve working professionals. Detailed program information — including course duration, tuition fees, and degree outcomes — can be found on the university's website at www.calmu.edu.

Facilities and Equipment

CalMU provides modern classroom facilities equipped to support graduate-level education. The San Diego Campus is located at 3550 Camino Del Rio N., Suite 208, San Diego, CA 92108. In-Residence Sites are also available for select programs and modalities: San Jose (505 S. Market Street, San Jose, CA 95113) and La Puente (1720 Walnut Ave, La Puente, CA 91744). Security cameras are installed throughout facilities, and building access is controlled to ensure the safety of all students, staff, and visitors.

Access to Facilities

All visitors to CalMU facilities must check in at the front desk upon arrival. Unaccompanied visitors are required to sign in and comply with all security protocols. Security personnel and staff monitor all entrances to ensure the safety of students, staff, and visitors.

2. Financial Assistance Information

Federal Financial Aid Programs

California Miramar University participates in Title IV federal student aid programs, including Direct Subsidized and Unsubsidized Loans and other applicable federal aid programs. Students must maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) to remain eligible.

State and Institutional Aid

CalMU provides information on available state and institutional aid opportunities for eligible students, including Cal Grants for qualifying California residents. Students are encouraged to complete the FAFSA annually to determine financial aid eligibility.

Veterans Benefits

CalMU is approved for GI Bill® educational benefits for eligible veterans and their dependents. For assistance with veterans' education benefits, please contact the Financial Aid Office at 858-653-3000.

Private Loans and Payment Plans

CalMU partners with approved lenders and financing services to offer flexible payment plans for students who may need additional financing options. Please contact the Business Office for details.

Net Price Calculator

Prospective students can use the Net Price Calculator available on the CalMU website (www.calmu.edu) to estimate their education costs and potential financial aid before enrolling.

3. Academic and Financial Aid Policies

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) Policy

Students must meet Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) standards to maintain financial aid eligibility. The SAP policy includes maintaining a minimum GPA, successfully completing coursework, and progressing within a designated timeframe. Students not meeting SAP standards will be placed on financial aid probation and may lose federal aid eligibility until the standards are met.

Return of Title IV (R2T4) Policy

If a student withdraws before completing more than 60% of a payment period, CalMU applies a Return of Title IV calculation to determine the portion of financial aid that must be returned to the federal government. Students are responsible for any outstanding balances that result from this calculation.

4. Safety, Emergency, and Compliance Measures

CalMU prioritizes campus safety through Clery Act compliance, confidential incident reporting, missing student protocols, and bystander intervention training. Security is enhanced with monitored cameras, timely warnings, fire safety protocols, and regular emergency drills, ensuring the campus community is prepared and protected.

Clery Act Compliance

California Miramar University complies with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act. The Annual Security Report, including three years of crime statistics, is available to all current and prospective students and employees. A printed copy is available upon request at no charge from the Student Services Department. Incident Reporting

Students and staff must report any suspicious behavior or emergencies immediately. An Incident Report must be completed with details of the occurrence and submitted to the Student Services Department or the front desk. All incident reports will be reviewed by the appropriate security personnel and administrative staff.

Confidential Reporting

CalMU encourages students and staff to report crimes confidentially. Victims or witnesses may file reports without revealing personal information. These reports will still be included in the

annual crime statistics but without identifying the reporting party. Anonymous reports may be submitted to the Student Services Department — this option is particularly important for individuals who may feel unsafe revealing their identity but wish to contribute to campus safety.

Missing Student Notifications

CalMU will respond to any missing student report within 24 hours. If a student enrolled at CalMU has been reported missing, CalMU will immediately begin an internal investigation and notify local authorities. The Student Services Department will serve as the main point of contact. CalMU will also reach out to the student's designated emergency contacts as part of this process.

Bystander Intervention Training

To foster a safer campus environment, CalMU provides educational programming for students, staff, and faculty focused on safe bystander intervention techniques. These workshops encourage community members to safely intervene when they observe potential harm, including harassment, discrimination, or violence. CalMU promotes a supportive community culture where individuals feel empowered to help others without fear of reprisal.

Sexual Misconduct Reporting Process

CalMU follows a structured procedure when dealing with reports of sexual misconduct, including domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking. Upon receiving a report, the Title IX Coordinator initiates an investigation following federal guidelines. Interim measures such as no-contact orders and academic adjustments may be provided to protect the complainant. Both parties are informed of the investigation's outcomes, and disciplinary actions are taken accordingly, ensuring a safe and fair process for all parties.

Timely Warning Notifications

CalMU will issue timely warnings to the campus community if a crime or potential threat is identified that may pose an ongoing risk. These notifications are sent through email, text messages, and posted announcements, ensuring all students, staff, and visitors are promptly informed. Warnings will contain essential details and safety instructions, empowering everyone to take precautions and avoid areas of potential danger.

Crime Prevention and Safety Tips

CalMU regularly shares safety tips to foster a proactive approach to personal safety. Best practices include:

- Walk in groups after dark and use well-lit pathways.
- Stay alert and avoid using your phone while walking alone at night.
- Secure personal belongings and lock vehicles.
- Know where campus emergency phones are located.

- Report suspicious behavior to Campus Security at 858-653-3000.
- Trust your instincts — if something feels wrong, act on it.
- Never prop open exterior doors or admit strangers into secured areas.

Security Cameras and Monitoring

Security cameras are installed throughout CalMU facilities to monitor campus activity. These cameras are monitored by designated security personnel who are responsible for ensuring the safety of the premises.

Emergency Evacuation Procedures

In case of an emergency, CalMU has designated evacuation routes displayed in key locations throughout each campus facility. All students and staff are expected to familiarize themselves with these routes and participate in regular emergency drills conducted by the university.

Emergency Notifications

In the event of an imminent threat, CalMU will issue timely warnings via email, text messages, and posted announcements. Students and staff are advised to follow all instructions provided during these notifications, which may include evacuation orders or shelter-in-place directives.

Active Threat Response: Run · Hide · Fight

- **RUN — Evacuate if Possible:** Have an escape route in mind. Leave belongings behind. Keep hands visible when approaching police. Call 911 once safe.
- **HIDE — If You Cannot Run:** Find a room you can lock or barricade. Silence your phone. Turn off lights. Stay behind large objects. Stay quiet and out of sight until officially cleared.
- **FIGHT — Last Resort Only:** If your life is in imminent danger and you cannot run or hide, act aggressively. Use anything available. Commit fully to your actions.

Fire Safety Protocol

CalMU facilities are equipped with fire extinguishers and emergency fire alarm systems. In case of a fire, all students and staff must follow the lighted exit signs to evacuate safely. Smoking and any fire-related activities are strictly prohibited inside all campus buildings. Fire extinguishers are regularly inspected and the emergency fire alarm system is tested to ensure functionality.

Annual Drills

To ensure readiness, CalMU conducts annual emergency drills for students and staff. After each drill, feedback is collected and adjustments are made to improve emergency response procedures.

5. Disability Services

CalMU is committed to ensuring accessibility for all students in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Reasonable accommodations are available to qualified students with disabilities. Students may request accommodations by contacting the Student Services Department at 858-653-3000 or by emailing the appropriate office listed in the Contact Information section of this report.

6. Alcohol and Drug Policies

California Miramar University maintains a zero-tolerance policy regarding the use of alcohol and illegal drugs on campus or at university-sponsored events. The manufacture, distribution, possession, or use of alcohol or controlled substances in violation of applicable law or institutional policy is strictly prohibited.

Alcohol and Drug Abuse Programs

CalMU offers support and referrals to substance abuse programs for students and employees who need assistance. Resources including counseling and external rehabilitation programs are available for those seeking help.

Disciplinary Actions

Students or employees found in violation of the alcohol or drug policy are subject to disciplinary actions, which may include suspension or expulsion, depending on the severity of the violation. All violations are documented and addressed through the appropriate disciplinary process.

7. Non-Discrimination and Sexual Harassment Policy

California Miramar University is committed to fostering a safe, inclusive, and supportive environment for all students and staff, free from discrimination based on race, color, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, religion, disability, or any other protected characteristic. CalMU adheres to Title IX regulations, ensuring that complaints of discrimination and sexual harassment are handled promptly and fairly.

The following conduct is strictly prohibited by federal law and CalMU policy:

- Sexual assault (non-consensual sexual contact or penetration)
- Domestic violence and dating violence
- Stalking
- Sexual harassment

Reporting Discrimination and Sexual Harassment

Students or staff who experience or witness discrimination or sexual harassment are encouraged to report the incident to the Title IX Coordinator. Reports may be filed in person, via email, or by phone and should include the date, time, location, individuals involved, and a description of the event. Contact information for the Title IX Coordinator is listed in Section 9.

The reporting and investigation process includes:

1. **Filing a Complaint:** File a formal complaint by contacting the Title IX Coordinator in person, via email, or by phone.
2. **Confidentiality and Privacy:** CalMU ensures all reports are handled with confidentiality to the greatest extent possible, balancing privacy rights with the need for a thorough investigation.
3. **Investigation Process:** Upon receiving a complaint, CalMU initiates a prompt and thorough investigation in accordance with federal guidelines, which may include interviews with the complainant, the accused, and witnesses, as well as review of relevant documents and evidence.
4. **Interim Measures:** CalMU may implement no-contact orders, academic accommodations, or schedule changes to protect the complainant during the investigation.
5. **Outcome and Disciplinary Action:** Following the investigation, CalMU will determine whether a policy violation occurred. Appropriate disciplinary actions will be taken. Both the complainant and the accused will be notified of the outcome.
6. **Appeals Process:** Either party may appeal the decision if a procedural error is identified or new evidence becomes available.

Retaliation against anyone who reports or participates in a Title IX proceeding is strictly prohibited. National Sexual Assault Hotline (RAINN): 1-800-656-4673 — Available 24/7, confidential.

8. Student Complaint and Grievance Process

Students may file formal complaints or grievances through the Student Services Department. CalMU follows a structured process to investigate and resolve complaints fairly and in a timely manner. Students may escalate unresolved grievances to applicable external agencies such as the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education (BPPE) or CalMU's accrediting body. Reporting to a Campus Security Authority (CSA) does not automatically initiate a formal investigation; students always have the right to decline to notify law enforcement.

Who to Report To

Incident reports should be submitted to the Student Services Department or the front desk at any CalMU campus or in-residence site (San Diego, San Jose, or La Puente). The security log is maintained at each front desk. After an incident is reported, CalMU initiates a review process to determine the appropriate response.
